09.00 – 10.00 am Al Fateh Islamic center – Grand Mosque

Bahrain's Grande Mosque is set against a back drop of palm trees and the sea. Its exquisite architecture, crowned by the worlds most largest fibre glass dome. Non muslims are welcome to visit the mosque, it is important to dress appropriately.

10.30 – 11.30 am King Fahad Causeway

Opened in 1986, this remarkable 15.5 miles (25km) feat of engineering links Bahrain and Saudi Arabia. It is one of the most expensive bridges in the world. The causeway traverses Umm Nasan Island, which is a sanctuary for wildlife, and at halfway point there is a facility area, including a restaurant.

11.45 - 12.15 am Camels Farm

The Camel farm is situated in Janabiya, take a camera and pose with the camels, take a ride or just watch the hundred or so camels as they race for their evening feed.

12.15 – 01.00 pm The Giant tumuli of Aali and potters artwork

This time- honored industry has been handed down from generation to generation, and the pottery at A'ali is now run by three brothers who learned the process from their father. The clay used at A'ali Pottery, which is the centre of the industry in Bahrain today, is made from a blend of two types of clay. These are combined to create the optimum blend fro their products, which range from traditional bread ovens to water pipes, plants plant pots and money boxes.

01.15 – 01.45 pm Tree of life

Sit under the Tree of Life, which is a large green mesquite tree, astonishingly spouting from sterile desert ground. Hundreds of years old and the only tree for miles, it offers a welcome respite from the glaring heat.
